Reducing Agitation in People with Brain Injury: Environmental Management System

Helping someone with a brain injury can be more challenging if they have agitation. This lecture will discuss agitation and how to help minimize it in the clinical setting along with helpful hints for home. This discussion will primarily focus on environmental management as a way to decrease occurrence of agitation. We will also be discussing the use of the agitated behavior scale as a way to objectively measure and track agitation in an individual with brain injury to promote a common language amongst clinicians.
