### About the Speaker

She has lead development of programs that utilize specialty technology including the FES bike and stepper, Dynavision, and BITS. Carrie has also lead the development of programs including the interdisciplinary Concussion Clinic and is active in community and government concussion policy and resource development.

### Description

Concussion is in the news on almost a daily basis, but it is still unclear how sustaining a mild traumatic brain injury will impact a person's function in the short and long term. This presentation will review some of the current outcomes based research regarding concussion treatment. Actual outcomes from concussion treatment clinics will be shared and utilized to discuss how data can be used to drive concussion management in the future.

2. What do concussion outcomes tell us about function after concussion.
3. What do outcomes look like in different concussion programs and demographics.
