New Reports on TBI from CDC's National Concussion Surveillance System

Two new reports are providing more insight and expanding knowledge on traumatic brain injury (TBI):

- The first, <u>published</u> in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine found that nearly 2 out of 3 TBIs reported among children (ages 5 to 17) were due to sports or recreational activities (mostly contact sports).
- The second paper, <u>published</u> in the journal of *Brain Injury* examined using machine learning to identify distinct groups of adults with TBI based on different symptoms to help inform next steps in clinical diagnosis and symptom-based treatment.




