




















































































- Adopts and follows protocols
- Provides care provider at contests involving contact or limited contact activity



- Acts reasonably and in good faith in the best interest of the student
- Acts without undue pressure from school or its employees

No liability for injuries due to action or inaction of medical provider at contest



- Scheduled a care provider to be present and available at a contest
- Care provider was not able to be present due to documentable and unforeseeable circumstances
- · School otherwise followed protocols

No liability for failure to provide care provider at a contest





- Acting reasonably
- Acting in the best interest of the student
- Was acting without undue influence from school or its employees

No personal liability of medical provider for injuries due to action or inaction
